#### **Learning Objectives for Inmate Transport/ Escorting Inmates**

#### **Reasons for Inmate Movement – Outside the Secure Perimeter**

The greatest risk occurs when we move inmates outside the containment of the facility.

Below is a list of reasons why such movement is necessary:

- Court appearances
- Transfer to another correctional facility
- Medical Emergencies
- Scheduled Doctor Appointments
- Funerals
  - When immediate family members of an inmate have deceased, the inmate may be permitted to attend funeral services.
- Seriously ill family members
  - On seldom occasions, inmates may be allowed to visit family members who are suffering from serious or life-threatening illnesses.
